I will be putting forth a recommendation that the rent on Archive storage for 2023 be raised as our cost has remained unchanged for several years. The goal for this year is to take an inventory of items in the collection. I would also like to document the effect of the pandemic on District 02 and our groups, such as the meetings that were displaced or disbanded, along with the new online groups, and the stories of the garage meetings as well as the meetings in the parks and woods. I will be asking for feedback from GSRs and members to add a few personal stories. It will take me a while to accomplish these goals.

the report from the CPC Committee from the Delegates Workshop:

A. Review progress of LinkedIn page. 1. On a global scale our site is an underutilized platform with 1786 followers. 2. The goals, both high and low priority, are strong, but are the financing and resources justifiable.?

B. Review draft pamphlet "AA in your all community." We read all the suggested changes and agree that they should be made.

C. Review Progress report on development of outward facing pamphlets for the mental health professional. We feel this pamphlet is unnecessary and our current pamphlets cover all or most questions.

D. Consider creating a new pamphlet designed to help CPC committees reach as many doctors as possible. There is literature available, as stated earlier. Personal outreach is most effective.

E. Review content and format of the CPC kit and workbook. We reviewed the content of the workbook and talked about suggested changes to letters to military chaplains. The changes are ok.

Since I am only one person, I asked several people to attend the Delegates Workshop and sit on different committees. They will share their reports and experience today. Once I receive the minutes/reports from Area 74 I'll email them out to the GSRs, District officers and chairs. GSRs – please take this information back to your groups for discussion, collect your group conscience and bring your voice/vote to the April 9th Assembly which will be held in Rhinelander, WI (note the location change). Thank you for allowing me to be of service.

### Public Information: Barry B.

My name is Barry, and I am an alcoholic. The PI committee met on February 17, 2022. We had 6 members in attendance in person and one via zoom. We assembled the new PI display at our meeting. Thank you to those committee members in attendance and again, a shout out to Susan B. who provided the initial template design for the display. We also discussed any successes placing hotline cards and with library visits that were made.

At our last meeting, we stuffed envelopes with letters and a few pamphlets addressed to Appleton Area middle and high schools along with UW Oshkosh, Lawrence University and FVTC campuses in Appleton and Oshkosh. These letters have been mailed. Middle and high schools in Oshkosh will be our next task.

Our committee has six members registered to help staff our booth at the Recovery in Our Community event on March 30 at UW Oshkosh. We have our display ready to go along with a literature rack which we will be getting ready at our next meeting.

We will be discussing at our next meeting how to best utilize the Meeting Guide App to the newcomer alcoholic. We are always looking for new members to join us. #### Committee Report Highlights

**Archives**-Bob H. Brian asked if when discussing the Conference, did their committee focus on anything specific? Bob indicated, no. Brian asked if they voted on a specific theme for the conference and Bob indicated they wanted to leave it to the Delegate. Jane GSR 02, asked if anyone can make 15 of the previous suggestions for themes. Bob indicated yes. George Alt. DCM, asked if a submission form was needed to be submitted in order to be considered for the theme. Yes, the form needs to be submitted September this year.

**CPC**-Kevin W.

**Corrections**-Dani

**Finance**-Dave K.

**Grapevine and Trustee Committee**-Char V. Gerianne asked if the book *Finding a Higher Power* is replacing *Came to Believe*. Is the book a duplication of the same topic? Char indicated that it's possible. There was discussion about the changing of the words, "men and women" to "people." Is the Grapevine talking about substantial changes to our fellowship? Char indicated yes and that the Grapevine is its own entity and has full authority to make changes without the fellowship but the Grapevine is willing to give the body a voice and it is very much appreciated. RE: Trustees: wording may be changed to simpler terms for ego reduction, for example, from "trusted servants" to "trusting service." Char also wanted to clarify something from the Corrections committee, *Changes to the 5th Edition*: "There are always new forwards. The intent is not to change the Appendices."

**Literature**-Bill D. Barry B. District 02, questioned Item R—to expand on the vote taken a while ago for "Lustful enough to rape" in the 12 & 12. Bill stated that the vote taken during a very serious time with Covid may not have had a whole group conscience and is concerned that the vote didn't represent the body.

The consensus is to reconsider the vote. Today's literature committee re-voted on the measure to reconsider and the vote was 10 in favor and 2 to leave it alone. Jane M. noted that the Literature committee at the 71st General Service Conference in 2021 indicated that the subject of changes in the 12 & 12 came up and most did not want Bill W.'s language changed.

**Policy & Admissions and Report & Charter**-Jeff C. & Torv. In-person EDW (Equitable Distribution Workload) was explained in many of the break-out committees. There was a 3 year study with the GSO. (Secretary's note: as an example, the Corrections committee I sat on had agenda items that had nothing to do with Corrections. Some of the committees that had fewer Agenda items were given other committees' items to discuss so the load for all committees would be more proportionate. We spoke about Literature.)

**Policy & Admissions and Report & Charter**-Sara P. & Derek T. on ZOOM. Jane commented about how the Big Book has changed since its inception. Mike, PI, commented that "attractive ads" are another way of getting AA information to the masses.

**Treatment**-Dan S. *Living Sober* caused some discussion: Zac said that the words, "you can't die from getting plenty of rest" is presupposing a medical opinion. Some thought the passage should be removed. Barb S. noted that insomnia is mentioned and that "no one has died from a lack of sleep" is also a medical opinion. Jane noted that "The Doctor's Opinion" has helped countless alcoholics understand alcoholism.

**PI**-Rachel. The group discussed "Active vs. Passive" ads and determined that passive ads were in line with the PI stance on Public Service Announcements which can be found in the AA Guidelines on Public Information. Active ads felt more promotional and the committee did not agree with pursuing these types of Ads.

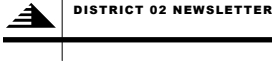
