DCM: Kendra.

There were 11 out of 26 DCMs at the monthly Area 74 DCM meeting. These meetings are held on the last Tuesday of the month. Much like the monthly GSR roundtable, the DCMs from Area 74 meet to discuss what is going on in their district, what is going well, and what we need help with. Last month, four of us DCMs had been struggling with the role. One of the DCMs had met with a past delegate who shared that service positions are free and meant to be fun. If you're not having fun, you're taking yourself too seriously. The AA Service Manual lists suggestions for DCM responsibilities. It was suggested to focus on 1 - 2 things and do those well. I thought this was great advice and wanted to share it with everyone in a service position. In addition to the day-to-day DCM responsibilities, situations, and interactions with persons during this position, it made me want to get out of service altogether. This is a dangerous space, especially for an alcoholic like me. Service is one side of the triangle; I am in a tough spot without it. With the time I have left as DCM, I will take a step back and refocus. One of my goals as DCM was to update District 02 Guidelines; its last revision was in 2017. We have made significant progress on this project. I also serve on the AA Service Workshop and Moose & Goose, both held in April and have been an active member of the Corrections Committee for the last six years. I could not attend the Delegates Workshop on March 11th due to the time needed with family.

Article VII District 02 Financial Structure and Ongoing expenses; ADD Section 1.09: District 02 D.C.M. and Committee Chairs will be responsible for preparing and presenting an annual budget at the district meeting. Past experience suggests the following timeline: In early July, the D.C.M. sends out a notice to all District Committee Chairs, requesting a completion of a budget request form. The notice will kindly request the return of the form no later than a week before the August district meeting. Upon receipt of all forms, the district Treasurer will complete the upcoming calendar year budget document to include year-to-date totals for the current year and projected budget for the following year. The draft document is presented for discussion and review to District 02 prior to the August district meeting via electronic communication, publication in the district D.C.M., Treasurer and Committee Chairs should be present to answer questions from the body. The annual budget is presented at the December district meeting for approval. The district D.C.M., Treasurer and Committee Chairs should be present to answer questions from the body. The budget document will be maintained by the district Treasurer and should be forwarded to the incoming district Treasurer at each rotation.

Printed Newsletter - The question is should we be printing the newsletter with not receiving any payments? The discussion was tabled until next Distrcit meeting.

Rachel made a motion to make changes to Article I: Membership Section 2.04 from LCMs are each afforded one vote to LCMs. The belief was LCMs should not be awarded a vote. The motion did not pass to take away their vote.

A motion was made by Alex and seconded by James to close the meeting at 4:00 p.m. The motion passed. We closed with the responsibility statement.




