To start the meeting, DCM Kendra provided an overview of general housekeeping, welcomed new members, and invited introductions of guests and new GSRs.

The Guidelines for Consideration

1. Definition of Terms

District Committee Member Currently reads: District Committee Member (D.C.M.) is defined in the A.A. Service Manual as follows: "He or she is a G.S.R. elected by the other G.S.R.s to represent the groups of their district in area committee meetings and coordinate service activities in the district. Suggest replacing it with "The heart of A.A. is the group, which elects a general service representative (G.S.R.). The G.S.R. attends district meetings that are made up of the groups in that district. The G.S.R.s elect a district committee member (D.C.M.). Thus, the D.C.M. is the vital link between the group's G.S.R. and the area service structure, including the area's delegate to the General Service Conference." From the A.A. Pamphlet Your D.C.M. F-12 Reasoning: Original content is no longer valid.

2. Article III: D.C.M., L.C.M.s, and District Officers and Duties, Section 1.00

Currently reads: The duties of the District Committee Member (D.C.M.) and the Alternate D.C.M are described in Chapter 3 of the A.A. service manual. Update to read: The duties & responsibilities of the District Committee Member (D.C.M.) and the Alternate D.C.M are described in the A.A. Service Manual. Reasoning: Chapters in the A.A. service manual can change. This leaves it general yet directs us to the A.A. Service Manual resource.

3. Article III: D.C.M., L.C.M.s, and District Officers and Duties, Section 6.00

Currently reads: The L.C.M.'s job is a two-way communication link between the District and the G.S.R.s in the Local Committee Members' sub-districts, and the L.C.M.s are responsible to the D.C.M. The L.C.M.s regularly attend all district meetings. They receive reports from the groups through G.S.R.s and frequent personal contact with groups in their sub-districts. They may hold special meetings of all G.S.R.s in their subdistricts. They help the D.C.M. cover the District, which would be impossible for the D.C.M. to do on a group-to-group basis. They provide groups with "Group Change Forms" and generally assist the D.C.M. in obtaining group information. They keep the groups and G.S.R.s informed about District activities and make sure that G.S.R.s are acquainted with The A.A. Service Manual, Twelve Concepts for World Service, the G.S.O. bulletin, Box 459, the Twelve Traditions, workbooks and guidelines from G.S.O., and other service material. They help the G.S.R.s make reports to their groups and encourage them to bring new A.A. members to district service events. They keep groups informed about Conference-approved books and pamphlets. They regularly keep in touch with the D.C.M. and bring Traditions problems to the attention of the D.C.M. They also regularly practice talking to groups, new and old, about the responsibilities of general service work and its rewards, as well as helping groups elect a G.S.R. and other service positions. The L.C.M.s assist new groups with A.A. catalogs, recommended literature, and books. L.C.M.s also help the groups develop a well-informed group conscience on matters affecting the group or A.A. as a whole, encouraging the use of A.A. Traditions and Concepts to achieve harmony. Update to read: "The L.C.M.'s job is primarily that of a two-way communication link between the District and the G.S.R.s in the Local Committee Members' sub-districts, and the L.C.M.s are responsible to the D.C.M. The L.C.M.s regularly attend all district meetings." Reasoning: each D.C.M. is different in the way they facilitate the District. If we list these in the guidelines, then we are limiting flexibility. Second, the A.A. Service Manual offers suggestions on Role & Responsibilities for D.C.M.s, listed in the service manual, are common, but not all districts take on all those tasks. Third, L.C.M.s should not replace the voice of the group, the G.S.R., reporting back on the G.S.R.'s/Group's behalf.

4. Article I: Membership; Section 2.00 Voting Membership; Section 2.04

Currently reads: L.C.M.s are each afforded one vote. Update to read: L.C.M.s are non-voting members of District 02 Reasoning: If the L.C.M.s report to the D.C.M., their vote is duplicated and could interfere with G.S.R. votes at the district level. The L.C.M.s should not replace the voice of the group, the G.S.R.
