Casa Claire

An alumnus reached out to Jodi and requested a donation for some Big Books, Grapevines, 12 x 12, Daily Reflections. Jodi asked if the intention was to have the books kept at the facility or given to residence to take home. The books are to be passed out to the women and are free to take home for those who want them. The books donated in 2023 have already been distributed to women. There was a question of whether the committee's intent in donating books is to be left in the house, or for residents to take. Consensus, the books are better in their hands than collecting dust on the shelf. There are currently 11 women in the facility now. Hardcover for Oshkosh, 5 Big Books were \$72. Comments below:

- What if we purchase the books by the case which is about \$212.00 so we could get them wholesale. Dylan will call the Central Office and Solutions to see what they could offer for the price.
- Better to have books in the hands of alcoholics
- Soft Cover are less expensive, so maybe buying them instead of hardcover
- As far as 12x12 and Daily reflections, perhaps they could get them as they grow in their recovery.
- Right now we would like purchase a case of soft cover big books and see where we are at the end of the year. We can increase our budget request for next year.
- Mooring and Casa and Nova allow outside speaker meetings, but we believe it is primarily alumni.
- We are running low on pamphlets as well – Rita and Dylan are going to inventory what they each have in their possession. They will provide the name of the pamphlet and how many they have. And they will email it to Jodi, so she can compile a complete inventory.

- How Many Additional (Fourth Edition Big Books would your Clients Need? *Maybe 3-4 , to have on the book shelves.*
- Would these Books be Left at this Facility, Or would they be taken with when they leave? *No, they would stay at the facility for future clients benefit*
- Is there a Preference Of Big Books Needed? *No I do not believe there is, they would be grateful for whatever they receive. Examples// Standard size Hard Cover, Soft Cover, Small Pocket size Big Books. We will provide 3 or 4 regular Big Books*
- Bring Speaker Meetings inside Your Facility, (Once a Month)
 - Mon- Wed any evening after 6:30pm , and then Saturday evenings are open as well.
 - Since This is Only a Men's Facility, would you want only Men Or Possible Coed? *Men would be best. We will add this to the new business for next month.*

Agenda Items for next meeting

- Dylan reporting back to the committee on costs for soft cover Big Book. Jodi will purchase them from where we can get the best price.

DCM-Jane. I sent informational emails to District officers and GSR's.

Discovered 2 Group Contact people and 2 new GSR's - began doing their paperwork and helped them make connections to AA as a whole.

Attended the Service Workshop presented in Marquette MI on Aug 3. There were about 40 people. A few things stood out: 1. Be sure to greet the new person in the meeting. 2. Service is a Commitment. (I'd rather be committed to Service than to a nut ward!) 3. Area Treatment Committee needs people. (Go to Area74.org to connect with them). 4. If you feel something is missing in your life or program, it may be your Service Work needs more focus. 5. 500 people per day in the US are dying from alcohol use. 6. Said sarcastically by a past Delegate: "There must be someone taking care of all this...it couldn't be me!"

Wrote District meeting report, DCM message, agenda, and sent in flyers for the newsletter.

Still announcing Area 74 Fall Conference at most meetings I attend.

Attended a zoom meeting for all Area DCM's. 2 Districts talked about elderly people running the meetings and were afraid they might fall and not be found. These are very small meetings. Heard, also, about summer campfire meetings, picnic, and cookout meetings 😊. District 05 is doing AA information booths at fairs.

Attended Area PI meeting on zoom. Gave report on progress with billboards to be posted somewhere in Area 74.

AAWS (AA World Services) Highlights are on AA.org. Here are a few: 1. The General Service Conference final report is now available. 2. There is a new AA literature catalog now available. 3. There are 2 new videos out, they are directed at young people. 4. Continued support for GSO is needed.

TRADITION NINE

“A.A. as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.”

Our founders learned in the beginning that giving orders to an alcoholic was definitely not the way this fellowship could be run. They discovered they could do no more than offer suggestions – mild ones at that. They recognized they could not dictate to fellow members individually or collectively. How then does our disorganized organization continue to function? Has anyone ever belonged to a club or organization that had no leaders or any membership rules? In Alcoholics Anonymous we have one very unusual condition that other organizations do not have. Unless each of us follows to the best of our ability the “suggested” 12 Steps, our days of sobriety are numbered. Drunkenness and disintegration are not penalties inflicted by people in authority; they are the result of personal disobedience to spiritual principles. We must obey certain principles or we die. This same idea applies to the group also. Unless there are some sort of adherence to A.A.’s 12 Traditions, the groups can also disintegrate and die.

It was clear to our founders that we could never name boards to govern us, but we will always need to authorize workers to serve us. These workers are assuming responsibility – never taking on authority.

Alcoholics Anonymous is a society without organization, run only by the spirit of service – a true fellowship.

PRAYER, MEDITATION, AND SELF EXAMINATION by Larry R.

When first he came into the rooms, unsure of what he'd find
He heard the people say some things that never crossed his mind
Slogans written on the walls and lists that did suggest
Steps he'd need to follow for his need to drink divest

Prayer and meditation combined with self-examination
A member said were critical for building a foundation
A foundation that will help to fight against the urge to drink
The new man could not understand the way these people think

A lot of us were just the same, confused by all this talk
Hearing what they said to do caused some of us to balk
We had not prayed in many years, did not know how to start
Or even if we did believe that God should play a part

As for meditation, how could that help us abstain
This was a thing for Buddhist monks, repeating some refrain
And self-examination, well, there was no need for this
Why bring up all our defects, they were better left dismissed

But slowly some of these things did begin to take affect
The first was prayer to someone's God, and hoped that we'd connect
We were unsure if this would work, but still gave it a go
It could not hurt and maybe something good would start to grow

We'd never tried to meditate; this concept was brand new
Yet said we'd give this thing a try, but knew not what to do
Close our eyes, sit very still and try to keep from thinking
But thoughts arose, we wondered what this had to do with drinking

This self-examination thing was not at all what we expected
A wallow in self-loathing was the thing we had suspected
But we were told, a balance sheet, was what we had to make
To view the good that we had done along with our mistakes

To start to pray a simple please and thank you is one way
So, thoughts of using alcohol, you pray, will stay away
And thank you in the evening for the spiritual assistance
That helped you do the next right thing, an aid to your resistance

Meditation may be difficult when you first give it a try
To free your mind from all those constant thoughts that wonder by
Begin with a few minutes, close your eyes and start to drift
Into a space of solitude as all tension start to lift

Bedtime is the perfect time for self-examination
For looking back upon your day for any indication
Of incidents that had occurred that led you to react
In such a way that made you wish that you could take it back

Step Eleven states that when these three things are united
A spiritual experience will soon start to be ignited
Each part alone will help you navigate through nasty weather
But the best results are felt when they are put to use together

Rather, the *Plain Language Big Book* is a book crafted over several years by A.A. members and publishing professionals to support alcoholics on the path to recovery. The book is intended to help people who have a problem with alcohol gain access to A.A.'s lifesaving message.

For years, A.A. members have expressed a need for a *Plain Language Big Book*. Based on the shared experience of A.A. members, some people may not have regular contact with other A.A. members to help them understand the A.A. program of recovery and the specific vocabulary as it is used throughout the original book *Alcoholics Anonymous*. Other people have a hard time reading, especially books that were written long ago. This *Plain Language Big Book* is written in simpler language to support readers in their recovery.

This book is published in accordance with Advisory Actions passed by substantial unanimity of the General Service Conference (GSC) of Alcoholics Anonymous. In 2021, the 71st GSC advised that this book be developed. Progress reports, then sample chapters were reviewed at the 72nd and 73rd GSCs. The final draft of the *Plain Language Big Book* was reviewed and approved by substantial unanimity at the 74th GSC, in April 2024. This process and outcome adopts this text as Conference Approved Literature.

The *Plain Language Big Book* covers the core content of what is the "abridged version" (the edition without personal stories) of the original Big Book.

Readers are also encouraged to seek out the current edition of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous* and meet with A.A. members to support their own individual paths of recovery from alcoholism.
