Open positions 2024 Elections

District Budget - Kim. The 2025 budget is attached to the financial report.

Tom-the Grapevine has gone up in price. Does the budget need to be adjusted? Newsletter getting software why doesn't the secretary get a stipend?

Wednesday nights and weekends were the times of operation. As an impressionable youth I soon joined the ranks of "wanna be's." In other words, "I wanted what they had and was willing to go to any length to get it." After a training course I was soon falling through the air with the best of them.

During this time I was initiated into the party scene on Friday and Saturday nights. I was one of the first to reach the tavern and usually the last to leave. This presented no problem (or so I thought), because I had been introduced to tavern etiquette at an early age.

Before too long I was stopping at the bar before going to the airfield and jumping while three quarters in the bag. This continued for a few months until one of the pilots told me I had to make a choice: either skydive or drink – not both, because they didn't want a large crater in their nice flat drop zone with me and/or someone else in the bottom of it! Very rude of them if you ask me.

My pattern of drinking before anything continued for quite some time, until my present employer intervened. I was told to make a choice: either work or drink – not both, because they didn't want me to kill or hurt myself or anyone else. Very rude of them again.

After entering treatment and being introduced to the Twelve Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous, I found I didn't have to drink before doing anything. After a few months of sobriety I found it beat the hell out of drinking beer out of an old jump boot or anything else. I also found myself joining the ranks of "wanna be's" again. I wanted what they (A.A.) had and was willing to go to any length to get it.

Somedays life is not kind and I have to use the 12 steps more than on other days. But by using the 12 steps to the best of my ability plus my faith in a power greater than myself, the path I have chosen for today is smoothed. If it's not the right path I can always go back and start again.

Someday I hope to be able to continue my education in the aviation field, but that is not for me to say. All I can do is the footwork, the rest is up to my higher power. As long as my will coincides with his will only good things will happen.

In closing, I remember a card given to me by one of the greatest program ladies I know. It say "I may not be what I want to be, and I'm not what I ought to be, but thank God I'm not what I used to be."
