On Zoom we had our monthly DCM meeting on Jan 7. Nicholas (our Area 74 Delegate) chaired. He mentioned the new Area calendar for 2025. One fact about it is we only have a single Conference this year which is in May in Sturgeon Bay. All are welcome and no official Area business will be conducted. Just go and have FUN!

Also, Area Finance Committee Questions were mentioned. I have already emailed Nicholas the responses from our District. Brent H, Area treasurer, said they were received by the committee.

Preliminary Agenda Items (for the NY Conference) are also on the menu. I will email these again to GSR's and other District service folks. Examples of issues (Agenda Items) include a request to consider whether a Super Majority (75%) of voting members should be required to change or amend Founders Literature. (Currently it's a 2/3 Majority or 66%). Another issue is a possibility to request to remove the word "woman" from the Concept IV essay. (The way it reads now it could be seen as sexist and be offensive).

An Area Committee Meeting (ACM) took place on Jan 9 on Zoom. There we voted in Char V to be our Area 74 nominee for the position of East Central Regional Trustee.

District Budget Issues – During last month's district meeting, some people shared comments as it relates to the amount of money set aside in the budgets each year it isn't being used up. Harold had brought this topic up for 2 or 3 months. The budgets are only as good as the thought put into it. Just putting it in the budget just to have it available maybe isn't the best thing to do. Digger added some of us are new to this process of creating budgets. We should discuss the District Budget issues until August. Many of us are growing into new roles. Char shared that spending 50% of the budget is normal. The budget will never be right on. Some people may take a stipend and others will not. Some committees are spending money and making a big impact. Budgets always will have issues. Char shared some information on Area 74. Spent more money than they took in. There will always be a variance. We are still feeling the impact that Covid has had on us. Steve noticed that the budget for 2025 is the same as the budget for 2024. There is nothing wrong with looking at the budget and having further discussions. He would be willing to work with Harold on this. Jeff added he would like to be part of this process. More to come.

New Business:

East Central Regional (ECR) Trustee Nominee Vote Outcome – Char was voted in on 12/9/24. Char was present at the district meeting and spoke a bit about the regional structure. Every 4 years, areas elect a trustee. This is someone who sits on the GS board. There are a total of 21 trustees. They serve AA. There is a lot of travel. Each area has an option to submit a name as their nominee along with a resume. Delegate presents the candidate and then a vote is taken (2/3 majority).

Bob made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 3:19 p.m. Harold seconded the motion. Closed the meeting with the Responsibility Declaration.

A speaker at the meeting brought the topic, Desperation Got many members sharing, was a real good conversation He asked of those who shared to only give their epilog Refrain from wasting time with just another drunk-a-log

For most of us that state of desperation was the end We'd reached a point of self-disgust, unable to pretend That somehow we were not that bad, the truth was plain to see We'd lost control, our lives a wreck, a social deportee

But just how did you get there, said the speaker to the members Please share with us that moment that you'll always still remember Some said it was the day their spouse had grabbed the kids and left Others said a DUI or prison time for theft

A near fatal experience caused another man to know Just one more binge and he was toast, it was the final blow Loss of jobs and money was again a common theme The knowledge they had lost it all, bereft of hope and dreams

But there were some whose path to desperation were diverse They had not been arrested, lost their livelihood or worse Did not lose their family or end up in the ER Had not been expelled from school or ever wrecked their car

The reasons lots of people reach desperation are external An event that brings life crashing down, existence now infernal Yet, there are those that reach this desperation from within Their feeling of self-loathing starts their journey to begin

Internal desperation may take longer to arrive Since not the worst has happened, hope to change is still alive They tell themselves, should any of those events to them transpire They'd quit the drink and finally get the help that they require

But as the worst thing happens <u>not</u>, the drinking will proceed Waiting for that shoe to drop, the drinker will not cede Then comes a day when, from within, a light begins to glow Internal desperation has arrived and then they know

The jig is up, doors closing fast, their self-unrecognized The being that they have become appears before their eyes They know they must surrender, their self-will is no avail A final chance, this path to desolation to derail

In the end, no matters how we reach our desperation It is the thing that <u>starts</u> us to a new found destination A hope, at last, to right ourselves, regain our self-respect To be who we were meant to be, our old self resurrects

THE NEWCOMER – BABIES - PIGEONS

A.A. depends on the newcomer. It doesn't matter what we call new people, babies on the west coast or pigeons on the east coast. What does matter is that we need them as much as they need us.

I can remember my first meeting like it was yesterday, and I can say I was scared, embarrassed, and doubtful. I felt like a whipped, wet, shaking, quaking poodle. I can remember being told to attend at least 90 meetings in 90 days, get to know the program, and get to know the people. That first month walking into different meetings was almost as scary and fearful as my first meeting.

I was very fortunate because my Higher Power directed me to those meetings where everyone made me feel welcome. God knew I needed to feel accepted and for that reason every meeting I attended someone would always say "Hi", or shake my hand and say, "Glad you came, keep coming back." Every meeting I attended the person leading the meeting would say, "Is there anyone here with less than 30 days sobriety? We don't want to embarrass you. We would like to get to know you." For me that was great. I would get to say "Hi," and many times I opened up and said I was afraid. After every meeting people would say "Hi." Some gave me their phone numbers and said "I know how you feel; I've been there myself. Call me if you like."

Having the meeting start out with the leaded asking if anyone was new to A.A. was not embarrassing to me at all, and for the first 30 days it made me feel welcome and kept me coming back.

I get awfully wrapped up in myself at times, but I try to remember how a newcomer feels when he or she attend their first few A.A. meetings. I try to give back what I got: a handshake and a warm hello. It's not easy for me because I'm shy and I'm not always in a good mood, but I keep trying.

I don't get to ask the group if there is anyone in attendance in their first 30 days of sobriety as I have not led any meetings yet, but I will when I get the chance. I'm going to ask so I can get to know them. So they will feel welcome and keep coming back. These newcomers help me to stay sober and I'm grateful to this program of Alcoholics Anonymous.

I have to remind myself all the time that this is a program of action, and I have to do it. No one can or will do it for me and that's O.K. I hope you feel this way to. Say "Hi" to a newcomer today.
